The Marine Mammal Health and Stranding Response Program was established by Congress in 1992 under Title IV of the Marine Mammal Protection Act (MMPA) to: (1) facilitate the collection and dissemination of reference data and assess health trends; (2) correlate marine mammal health with available data on physical, chemical, biological and environmental parameters; and (3) coordinate responses to strandings and unusual mortality events (UMEs). Over 100 organizations partner with NOAA Fisheries to investigate marine mammal strandings. Stranding Network members are trained professionals & volunteers from nonprofit organizations, aquaria, universities, and coastal state and local governments. Each case provides information about the causes of strandings and factors that may impact the health of marine mammals in the wild.
